Community Foundation of the North State Opens Fall 2026 Grant Fund Opportunities

The Community Foundation of the North State (CFNS) is pleased to announce the opening of its Fall 2026 grant fund opportunities, providing nonprofit organizations across the North State with access to funding. Fall 2026 grant funding opportunities include:

- **Burney Regional Community Fund** – The Burney Regional Community Fund supports needs within the communities of the greater Burney area; Burney, Cassel, Fall River Mills, Hat Creek, McArthur, and Old Station – in accordance with boundaries set by the Fall River Joint Unified School District. All grant requests for this Fund must be submitted online by midnight on September 2, 2026.
- **Animal Welfare Fund** – The Animal Welfare Endowment Fund provides for the care and feeding of animals in Shasta, Siskiyou, and Tehama counties. Grants will be made to nonprofit organizations who promote the welfare of animals in the following categories: supporting homeless animals, supporting owned pets, supporting wildlife, supporting working animals, and disaster preparedness for animals. All grant requests for this Fund must be submitted online by midnight on September 9, 2026.
- **Community Arts Endowment** – This fund allows grants for the presentation and creation of "new artistic work" to be given in support of artists and art projects. Examples range from visual public art, such as murals and sculptures to other graphic art forms, displayed or presented in public areas in Shasta and Siskiyou counties. All grant requests for this Fund must be submitted online by midnight on September 9, 2026.
- **Redding Rancheria Community Fund** – Grants from the Redding Rancheria Community Fund will be awarded to Shasta and Trinity County organizations or general support excluding salaries and may help with things like capital improvements/renovations, equipment, programs, services, etc. All grant requests for The Redding Rancheria Community Fund must be submitted online by midnight on September 16, 2026.
